

Cornhill Community Action Status report - 9th September 2021

CAT: On September 7th, Angela received a pack of information from Paul Stevens, solicitor for NCC's Legal Services. This contains the formal conveyance in draft. Martin has read it through and there are only a couple of points to raise. CPC should be aware that the school property extends right up to the electricity substation and the owners of houses in Tweed View have a formal right of way to and from St Helen's Gardens.

William Carrington has offered the services of his solicitors, Boodle Hatfield who have specialised experience in conveyancing and we recommend his offer be accepted.

Planning application: subsequent to advice received an application has been on the basis that this is a minor development. We expect to hear about this by September 13th as this is the last day by which they must respond.
